Chicago Slaughterhouse Sued for Public Nuisance

excessive noise ... feathers and dust ... smell of chicken feces and slaughter

Chicago, IL - A lawsuit was filed this week against Ciales Poultry, a slaughterhouse that slaughters chickens, rabbits and guinea pigs, among other animals, located on the 2100 block of Armitage and is owned by Raul Perez. The Lawsuit filed by the Patterson Law Firm and 1818 on behalf of a neighbor, complains of the conditions that neighbors of the slaughterhouse endure on a daily basis.

The lawsuit is based on violations of Chicago Zoning Law, nuisance and breach of the right of quiet enjoyment of property. The complaint specifically states the Plaintiff has had to deal with the following conditions:

- excessive noise from the chicken, mainly in the middle of the night, preventing her from sleeping and enjoying the premises due to the incessant crying of tightly-packed chickens and those chickens being slaughtered.
- feathers and dust regularly collect around the Premises and in the alley between buildings.
- smell that frequently emanates from Ciales is a “vile mix of feces and the smells of slaughter..”
